Emergency Overview

Physical Description & colour: Clear blue liquid.

Odour: Slight ammoniacal odour.

Major Health Hazards: Glyphosate is practically nontoxic by ingestion, with a reported acute oral LD_{50} of 5600 mg/kg in the rat. The toxicities of the technical (glyphosate acid) and the formulated product are nearly the same. No major health hazards are known
